	<p>Superintendent Report: Geoff Andrews presented and reviewed the Cognia Accreditation and accreditation hand out</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Accreditation is for all the schools in the diocese. We are the first diocese in the state to gain accreditation as a group of schools like this instead of individual schools. • 183 stakeholders were interviewed by the Review Team, including Bishop Vincke, Principals, Parents, Teachers/Staff, Community Partners, and Students • Powerful Practice #1 - The diocese benefited from long-standing leadership focused on systemic continuous improvement with the recent addition of system-level personnel supporting these efforts to fruition. • Powerful Practice #2 – The mission is supported by engaged stakeholders and through the effective governance and diocesan policies and practices. • Powerful Practice #3 – The learning culture of high expectations ensures equitable opportunities for students and positive relationships among all stakeholder groups. • Powerful Practice #4 – Resources were fully utilized to support schools and teachers to meet the learning needs in their classrooms. • Improvement Priority – The use of data to drive decisions for instruction and organizational effectiveness was inconsistent and less formalized. <p>COE encouraged to place on social media and to inform people of positive results. - John Krajicek reported tuition income close to being on budget. 12 families 60/90 past due.
- 6th grade pre enrollment apprx. 26 family
- There has been a steady return of 22-23 commitment forms and scholarship applications are coming in.

Auction: (Fundraising)

- Renee Thompson reported-she was pleased with the overall outcome of auction
- Itemless item: raised \$53,000 including match from Endowment
- The auction raised \$95,000
- Raising over \$140,000 total
- The itemless item funds will go toward: Practice field and football field scoreboard \$5800, Smartboards 7 for \$23,000 and Gymnasium sound system \$12,500 (waiting for final bid)
- An \$11,000 surplus is available
- COE discussion followed on how to use the surplus. Options include: VB standards at \$6500, Gutters \$20,740*, Gym Structure supports:\$17,500* and Paint strippers to be split with St. Mary's \$4,500
- * denotes items eligible for funding through the Wolsiefer Gift
- Discussion for next year's auction to keep itemless item bidding open longer to include increments of less than \$500. (example \$500, \$250, \$100 etc)
- Match Madness raised \$24,322 before the match
- Sports Gate History- It was reported Pre Covid gate income from 2016-2019 averaged over \$20,000. During and Post Covid income from 2019-2022 averaged \$9887.
