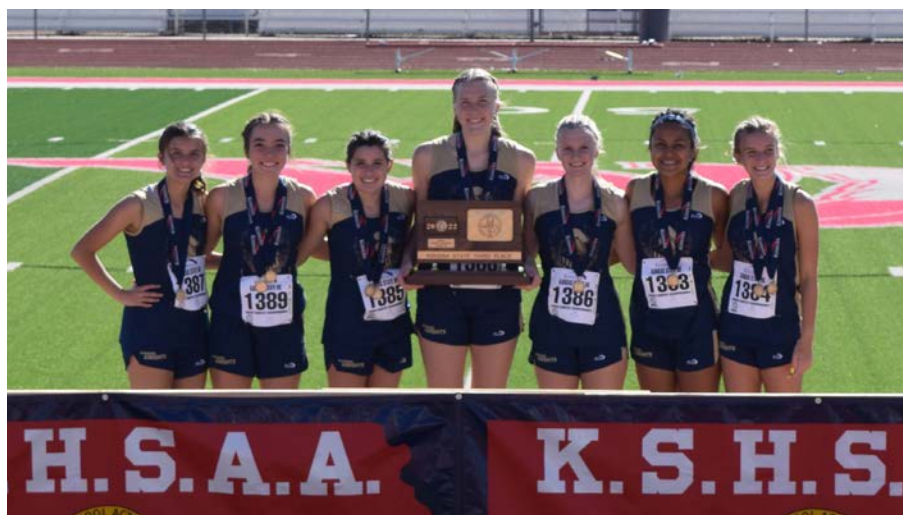

STATE ATHLETICS



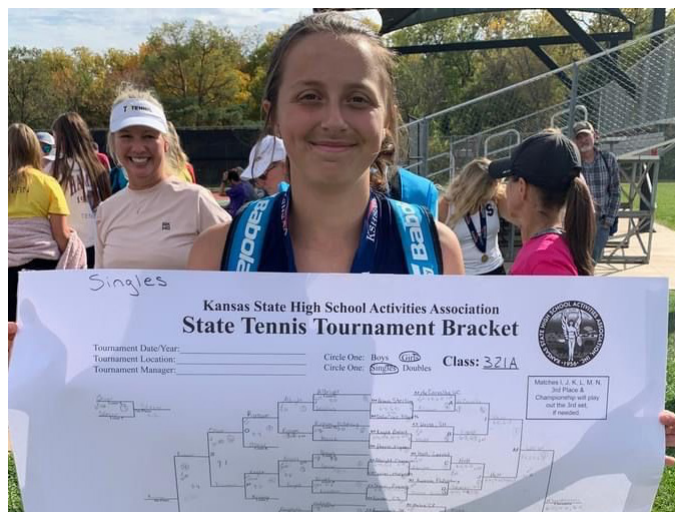

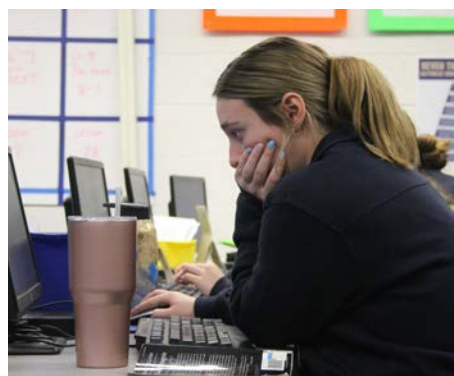
